**TITHES.**

One tenth of the produce of the land taken in kind.\*

[The tithe is assessed by weight or measure on the amount of the crop; and prices for the different articles are fixed by the *Medjliss Idarés* (Administrative Councils) of the several Districts, with an appeal to the *Central Medjliss Idaré*.]

**FINES:—**

Fines on the amount of Tithe due are leviable for non-payment within time prescribed as under, viz. :—

In respect of tithes on Wheat, Barley, Vetches and Oats (payable during the months of October and November), if not paid before the 1st December, 5 per cent. on the amount then due. If not paid before the 1st January following, a further 5 per cent. on the amount of tithes unpaid.

In respect of tithes on all produce, Carobs, Cotton, Silk, Linseed, Wheat, Barley, Vetches and Oats excepted \* (payable during the months of December, January and February), if not paid before the 1st March, 5 per cent. on the amount then due. If not paid before the 1st April, a further 5 per cent. on the amount of tithe unpaid.

## VERGHI.

1. *Emlak or Kimat.*

4 per 1,000 on the value of lands, houses and immoveable property.

2. *Irak.*

4 per cent. on the rental of lands, houses and immoveable properties.

3. *Temettu.*

3 per cent. on trade profits and incomes (excluding salaries).

## EXEMPTIONS:—

Persons entitled to exemption from tithe on Olive trees, planted under the Law of 29 Zilhidjé, 1278, may apply to the Verghi Department for exemption from verghi on such trees, until the immunity from tithe thereon shall expire.

Artisans who do not keep shops and who receive daily hire for their labour † (a), labourers receiving daily hire † (a), and gardeners of Varoshia who were exempt under Turkish law (b), are exempted from payment of Verghi Temettu.

By letter from the Ministry of Finance of 16 Shewal, 1289, agriculturists, for the purpose of assessing the Temettu tax, are divided into three classes. The first comprises those who, having sufficient land, do not engage in commerce but are always occupied with agriculture even though they should take charcoal or other material to town twice or thrice a year for sale, or transport goods with their carts in order to provide for the necessities of their existence. These are exempt from Temettu. The second comprises those who, not having sufficient land for their subsistence, besides their own, work other peoples' land for hire or in partnership or do business with charcoal, firewood, &c. Temettu should be collected from these according to their assessed profits derived from sources other than the cultivation of their lands. (This category does not include those who hire other peoples' lands for the purpose of farming and who pay tithe on the produce raised upon such land: these are exempt from Temettu.) The third comprises those who may have sufficient land for their subsistence yet, being well off and doing business in other ways, leave their agricultural business to be carried on by their farm servants and employés. Temettu should be collected from these in proportion to their profits other than those derived from the cultivation of their lands.

Further the Government has ruled that a man who carries on a lucrative business in addition to agriculture should be assessed for and pay Temettu on the profits derived from such business.

Gardeners are to be dealt with in the same manner as agriculturists.

BEDEL-I-EUSHER.

(Equivalent of Tithes.)

An annual payment taken in lieu of tithes on the conversion of Arazi-Mirie (arable State land) to another category, as, for instance, on the erection on it of buildings, threshing-floors and sheep-folds, or on its conversion into forest or grazing ground.

BEDEL ASKERI.

(Military Exemption Tax.)

Two shillings and four and a half copper piastres per head for all male inhabitants of the Island, not being foreigners, of not less than 18 years or more than 60 years of age.

EXEMPTIONS:—

Priests of all religious denominations; all persons who are exempt from Military Service by Turkish law either by personal service or by payment made before the passing of Ordinance No. V. of 1878; all persons mentally or physically incapacitated from Military Service; and all persons in the Military or Civil employment of the Government of the Island.

SHEEP AND GOAT TAX.

2½ silver piastres (8½c.p.) per head yearly on every sheep and goat one year old and upwards.

The tax on goats may be increased and that on sheep decreased by the High Commissioner in Council provided that no increase shall be made in the total amount receivable as calculated upon the basis of the last preceding official returns of the numbers of sheep and goats in the Island.

Sheep and goats that are concealed with a view to avoid enumeration are charged double tax.

PIG TAX.

4½ copper piastres per head yearly on every pig over three months old.

Concealed pigs are subject to the same penalty as sheep and goats.

IMPORT DUTY—*continued*.

## TABLE OF EXEMPTIONS.

All goods imported for the Government of Cyprus to be used in the public service and duly certified as so imported by the Chief Secretary to Government.

All Military Stores imported by Her Majesty's War Department and duly certified as such by the Officer to whom they are consigned.

All goods imported for the use of the High Commissioner and duly certified by the High Commissioner to be so imported.

All articles of Military equipment imported by and for the use of any Officer of Her Majesty's land forces.

Goods and Stores of every description supplied under contract with Her Majesty's War Department for the public use of Her Majesty's land forces, duly certified as such by the principal Commissariat Officer, such certificate to be countersigned by the Chief Secretary to Government.

Uniforms of Public Officers and professional robes of Legal or Judicial Officers in the employment of Her Majesty's Government, provided that such uniforms or robes are introduced for the personal use only of such officers, and have been duly authorized.

Fire-arms for the personal use of Officers of Her Majesty's Naval and Military Forces.

Paving stones imported by Municipal Councils in the Island to be used for the paving of streets within the Municipal limits, and duly certified as so imported by the President and Cashier of any Municipal Council.

Vats, and staves and hoops for use in constructing casks and vats.

Microscopes and all microscopical and other apparatus or appliances for purposes of investigation and scientific research.

Gymnastic apparatus, mathematical and generally all other instruments used in schools for educational purposes, which are imported for the use of schools.

Agricultural implements, atlases and maps, anchors and chains (ships'), bark, boats, charcoal, church furniture, and articles which are only to be used in the building and fitting up of churches and mosques and vestments and other articles necessarily used for religious services, coals, empty casks and sacks, fresh fish, gold bullion and specie, ice, lime, medicines and medical appliances, pitch and tar, printed books, resin, sawdust, silk worms' eggs, sponges taken by licensed boats, stationery, printing paper, sulphur, timber hewn or rough sawn, wheat, barley, oats, vetches, flour, chopped straw, cotton seed, fodder for cattle; and the following articles for use in the manufacture and examination of wine, viz.: grape and raisin crushers, separators, wine presses, wine pumps, wine filters, gauging rods, testing stills, hydrometers, saccharometers, gypsometers, mustimeters, acetimeters, ebullioscopes, sulphur syringes, and the following articles of machinery:—

Machinery for carding, spinning, weaving and finishing the manufacture of fibrous material, and cards for such machinery, machinery for telegraphic purposes, printing machines and presses, type and type machinery, type writers, sewing machines, knitting machines, locomotive engines, railway plant, machinery for steamboats, mills and foundries, steam boilers and engines of every description, steam boiler plates and tubes, grating bars, tile and brick making machinery, machinery to be used in the cutting and manufacture of tobacco, punching, shearing, plate bending, plate cutting, rivetting, drilling, boring, planing, shaping, slotting, screw making, sawing, tenoning, mortising, moulding, rebating, tonguing and grooving machines, lathes, file cutting, engraving, bolt making, rivet making, and washer making machines, machinery to be employed in the manufacture of ice, machinery for the manufacture of mineral waters, diving apparatus, weighing machines, pumps and other apparatus for raising water, winnowing, threshing, corn mills and flour dressing machinery, grain separators, oil presses, hydraulic, lever, screw or cam presses, cranes, derricks, crab-winchs, screw and other jacks.

All the machinery above stated, either whole or in parts, as also their fittings, connections and gearing.

## DRAWBACK OF IMPORT DUTY.

When any Import Duty shall have been paid in respect of any wine, spirits, malt liquors, tobacco, cigars, or articles of food supplied for the use of any mess on board any of Her Majesty's ships of war, a drawback of the amount of the duty so paid may be allowed, or if such goods are shipped from the Customs store before payment of duty, the amount of such duty may be remitted on the production of a certificate from the proper officer of Customs that such goods have been actually shipped on board one of Her Majesty's ships, a receipt from the Paymaster of such ship for the goods and a written undertaking from the Paymaster or other proper officer of such ship that if such goods or any part thereof shall be at any time re-landed, the duty shall be paid thereon.

In lieu of drawback of import duty paid in respect of any wine, spirits, malt liquors, tobacco, cigars or articles of food imported and subsequently actually consumed or used by Her Majesty's Land Forces, fixed money allowances are paid out of the Island Treasury to the Officers and Soldiers of Her Majesty's Land Forces quartered within the Island.

PHYLLOXERA.

With a view to prevent the introduction of the *Phylloxera*, the importation of certain articles from infected countries is prohibited.

## PUBLIC DEBT.

---

Under an Annex to the Convention of 4th June, 1878, between Great Britain and Turkey the former power has undertaken to pay to the Porte annually a sum representing the excess of Revenue over Expenditure calculated on the average of the five years preceding the date of the Convention, excluding the produce of State and Crown lands let or sold during that period. The amount to be paid has been determined to be £87,686 per annum ; this to be in addition to 4,166,220 okes of Salt to be paid in kind.

The sum of £113 11s. 3d. per annum has also become payable, under the same Annex, since the 4th September, 1884, when the Cyprus Government took over the administration of the Lighthouse Service in the Island. This sum represents 22% of the receipts of the Ottoman Lighthouse Administration which the Sublime Porte enjoyed under the concession granted the Company for lighting the Coast of Cyprus.

By a further Agreement of 3rd February, 1879, a further sum of £5,000 is to be paid annually to the Porte in respect of the produce of State lands.

The estimated value of the labour of prisoners employed on industrial work (shoe-making, tailoring, weaving, and dyeing) is £1,624 19s. 6c.p.
