TITHES.

One tenth of the produce of the land commuted for a money payment.*

[The tithe is assessed by weight or measure on the amount of the crop; and prices for the different articles are fixed by the *Medjliss Idarés* (Administrative Councils) of the several Districts, with an appeal to the *Central Medjliss Idaré*.]

FINES :—

Fines on the amount of Tithe due are léviable for non-payment within time pre-scribed as under, viz. :—

Ordinance V. of 1881, and Order of High Commissioner, in Council, No. 12, of 11th April, 1881, pub-lished in *Gazette* No. 69 of 18th April, 1881.

In respect of tithes on Wheat, Barley, Vetches and Oats (payable during the months of October and November), if not paid before the 1st December, 5 per cent. on the amount then due. If not paid before the 1st January following, a further 5 per cent. on the amount of tithes unpaid.

In respect of fresh winter broad-beans (payable during the months of January, February and March) if not paid before 1st April, 5 per cent. on the amount then due, and if not paid before 1st May, a further 5 per cent. on the amount then unpaid.

EXEMPTIONS:—

Persons entitled to exemption from tithe on Olive trees, planted under the Law of 29 Zilhidje, 1278, may apply to the Verghi Department for exemption from vergghi on such trees, until the immunity from tithe thereon shall expire.

Artisans who do not keep shops and who receive daily hire for their labour † (a), labourers receiving daily hire † (a), and gardeners of Varoshia who were exempt under Turkish law (b), are exempted from payment of Vergghi Temettu.

(a) Order of High Commissioner of 31st December, 1880.

By letter from the Ministry of Finance of 16 Shewal, 1289, agriculturists, for the purpose of assessing the Temettu tax, are divided into three classes. The first comprises those who, having sufficient land, do not engage in commerce but are always occupied with agriculture even though they should take charcoal or other material to town twice or thrice a year for sale, or transport goods with their carts in order to provide for the necessities of their existence. These are exempt from Temettu. The second comprises those who, not having sufficient land for their subsistence, besides their own, work other peoples' land for hire or in partnership or do business with charcoal, firewood, &c. Temettu should be collected from those according to their assessed profits derived from sources other than the cultivation of their lands. (This category does not include those who hire other peoples' lands for the purpose of farming and who pay tithe on the produce raised upon such land: these are exempt from Temettu.) The third comprises those who may have sufficient land for their subsistence yet, being well off and doing business in other ways, leave their agricultural business to be carried on by their farm servants and employés. Temettu should be collected from these in proportion to their profits other than those derived from the cultivation of their lands.

(b) Order of High Commissioner of 22nd June, 1881.

Further the Government has ruled that a man who carries on a lucrative business in addition to agriculture should be assessed for and pay Temettu on the profits derived from such business.

Gardeners are to be dealt with in the same manner as agriculturists.

AUTHORITY.

BEDEL-I-EUSHER.

(Equivalent of Tithes.)

An annual payment taken in lieu of tithe on the conversion of Arazi-Mirie (arable State land) to another category, as, for instance, on the erection on it of buildings, threshing-floors and sheep-folds, or on its conversion into forest or grazing ground.

BEDEL ASKERI.

(Military Exemption Tax.)

Two shillings and four and a half copper piastres per head for all male inhabitants of the Island, not being foreigners, of not less than 18 years or more than 60 years of age.

EXEMPTIONS :—

Priests of all religious denominations ; all persons who are exempt from Military Service by Turkish law either by personal service or by payment made before the passing of Ordinance No. V. of 1878 ; all persons mentally or physically incapacitated from Military Service ; and all persons in the Military or Civil employment of the Government of the Island.

SHEEP AND GOAT TAX.

2½ silver piastres (3½c.p.) per head yearly on every sheep and goat one year old and upwards.

The tax on goats may be increased and that on sheep decreased by the High Commissioner in Council provided that no increase shall be made in the total amount receivable as calculated upon the basis of the last preceding official returns of the numbers of sheep and goats in the Island.

4½ copper piastres per head yearly on every pig over three months old.

DRAWBACK OF IMPORT DUTY.

When any Import Duty shall have been paid in respect of any wine, spirits, malt liquors, tobacco, cigars, or articles of food supplied for the use of any mess on board any of Her Majesty's ships of war, a drawback of the amount of the duty so paid may be allowed, or if such goods are shipped from the Customs store before payment of duty, the amount of such duty may be remitted on the production of a certificate from the proper officer of Customs that such goods have been actually shipped on board one of Her Majesty's ships, a receipt from the Paymaster of such ship for the goods and a written undertaking from the Paymaster or other proper officer of such ship that if such goods or any part thereof shall be at any time re-landed, the duty shall be paid thereon.

In lieu of drawback of import duty paid in respect of any wine, spirits, malt liquors, tobacco, cigars or articles of food imported and subsequently actually consumed or used by Her Majesty's Land Forces, fixed money allowances are paid out of the Island Treasury to the Officers and Soldiers of Her Majesty's Land Forces quartered within the Island.

PHYLLOXERA.

With a view to prevent the introduction of the *Phylloxera*, the importation of certain article from infected countries is prohibited.

PUBLIC DEBT.

Under an Annex to the Convention of 4th June, 1878, between Great Britain and Turkey the former power has undertaken to pay to the Porte annually a sum representing the excess of Revenue over Expenditure calculated on the average of the five years preceding the date of the Convention, excluding the produce of State and Crown lands let or sold during that period. The amount to be paid has been determined to be £87,686 per annum ; this to be in addition to 4,166,220 okes of Salt to be paid in kind.

The sum of £113 11s. 3d. per annum has also become payable, under the same annex, since the 4th September, 1884, when the Cyprus Government took over the administration of the Lighthouse Service in the Island. This sum represents 22% of the receipts of the Ottoman Lighthouse Administration which the Sublime Porte enjoyed under the concession granted the Company for lighting the Coast of Cyprus.

By a further Agreement of 3rd February, 1879, a further sum of £5,000 is to be paid annually to the Porte in respect of the produce of State lands.

Taking an average of the number of prisoners employed on Public Works and valuing their labour at 4½c.p. per man per diem, the value of the services of the convicts during the year may be put at £1,208. The estimated value of the labour of prisoners employed on industrial work (shoe-making, tailoring, weaving, repairing tents and dyeing) is £913.
