EXEMPTIONS:-

Persons entitled to exemption from tithe on Olive trees, planted under the Law of 29 Zilhidjé, 1278, may apply to the Verghi Department for exemption from verghi on such trees, until the immunity from tithe thereon shall expire.

Artisans who do not keep shops and who receive daily hire for their labour \dagger (a), labourers receiving daily hire \dagger (a), and gardeners of Varoshia who were exempt under Turkish law (b), are exempted from payment of Verghi Temettu.

By letter from the Ministry of Finance of 16 Shewal, 1289, agriculturists, for the purpose of assessing the Temettu tax, are divided into three classes. The first comprises those who, having sufficient land, do not engage in commerce but are always occupied with agriculture even though they should take charcoal or other material to town twice or thrice a year for sale, or transport goods with their carts in order to provide for the necessities of their existence. These are exempt from Temettu. The second comprises those who, not having sufficient land for their subsistence, besides their own, work other peoples' land for hire or in partnership or do business with charcoal, firewood, &c. Temettu should be collected from these according to their assessed profits derived from sources other than the cultivation of their lands. (This category does not include those who hire other peoples' lands for the purpose of farming and who pay tithe on the produce raised upon such land: these are exempt from Temettu.) The third comprises those who may have sufficient land for their subsistence yet, being well off and doing business in other ways, leave their agricultural business to be carried on by their farm servants and employes. Temettu should be collected from these in proportion to their profits other than those derived from the cultivation of their lands.

Further the Government has ruled that a man who carries on a lucrative business in addition to agriculture should be assessed for and pay Temettu on the profits derived from such business.

Gardeners are to be dealt with in the same manner as agriculturists.

DRAWBACK OF IMPORT DUTY.

When any Import Duty shall have been paid in respect of any wine, spirits, malt liquors, tobacco, cigars, or articles of food supplied for the use of any mess on board any of Her Majesty's ships of war, a drawback of the amount of the duty so paid may be allowed, or if such goods are shipped from the Customs store before payment of duty, the amount of such duty may be remitted on the production of a certificate from the proper officer of Customs that such goods have been actually shipped on board one of Her Majesty's ships, a receipt from the Paymaster of such ship for the goods and a written undertaking from the Paymaster or other proper officer of such ship that if such goods or any part thereof shall be at any time re-landed, the duty shall be paid thereon.

In the case of derelict delivered into the custody of the Receiver there shall be charged the following fees instead of percentage, viz.:—

If the value of the ship or boat with her cargo equals or exceeds £600, two pounds for the first day, and one pound for every subsequent day during which the Receiver is employed on this service.

If the value of the ship or boat with her cargo is less than £600, half the above charges.

But if the amount reckoned according to this Rule exceeds a percentage of five per cent., the latter rate is to be charged.

NICOSIA DISTRICT:

Manicipal Commission, Niosia. The High Commissioner in Council under "The Municipal Councils" Law, 1885." The state of Superintendence and control of the town in the manner laid down by the Totalsh Law, by "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1882," and "The Municipal Councils' Law, 1885," in which last-named enactment the powers and duties of Municipal Councils are more particularly defined as follows:—

It is the duty of every Municipal Council-

To keep all reads, streets, squares and public places within the Municipal limits clean and in good repair, and sufficiently drained, lighted, and clear of obstructions.

I convide for the removal of all night soil and refuse from every house within the Municipal limits.

To provide that all drains, urinals, privies and cesspits within the Municipal limits shall be so constructed and kept as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

To prevent any trade or business from being carried on within the Municipal limits in such a manner as to be injurious to public health, or a source of public danger. To prevent the accumulation in any public or private place within the Municipal limits of any filth or refuse so as to be dangerous to the public health, and to take measures

of any filth or refuse so as to be dangerous to the public health, and to take measures for the abatement of any public nuisance arising from any public or private cesspool or drain, or otherwise.

To provide, or cause to be provided, a good and sufficient supply of water for the use of persons dwelling within the Municipal limits, and to keep, or cause to be kept, cleansed and in good repair all public fountains, drains and aqueducts, and to preserve the same from contamination.

To provide slaughter-houses and to regulate the slaughter of animals within the Municipal limits.

To provide for the inspection of all flesh, fish, vegetables and other provisions exposed for sale within the Municipal limits, and to seize and destroy all such provisions as are unfit for human food.

Generally to do such acts as may be necessary for the conservancy of the town, and preservation of the public health therein.

It is lawful for every Municipal Council to administer its affairs under the supervision of the Government, to dispose of its monies and to undertake all or any of the following things:

The paving, or improvement of any street or public place within the Municipal limits. The establishment and regulation of markets.

The allotment of special places within the Municipal limits for the carrying on of

particular trades dealing in perishable goods.

The construction and maintenance of public urinals and privies, ashpits and receptacles

for the tem porary collection and deposit of rubbish.

The fixing of the weights by which household bread exposed for sale is to be sold within Municipal limits, and providing that it shall not be sold otherwise than by weight.

It is lawful for every Municipal Council, with the consent of the High Commissioner in Council, to undertake all or any of the following things:

The arrangement and execution of general plans for the widening and straightening of roads and other public places within the Municipal limits.

The building of public buildings, quays, piers, docks, or other public works within the said limits.

The establishment, maintenance and regulation of hospitals, dispensaries, poor-houses and other philanthropic establishments.

Generally the doing of anything which may tend to promote the comfort and convenience of the people residing within the Municipal limits.

Every Municipal Council has the power, subject to the approval of the High Commissioner, to make bye-laws for the carrying out of all or any of the objects hereinbefore mentioned, and for the fixing and regulation of the following rates and fees to be received by the Corporation.

The fees to be taken for the slaughtering of animals at any Municipal slaughter-house.

The rates to be paid for stallage and pickers in the Municipal and picker

The rates to be paid for stallage and pickage in the Municipal markets.

The rates to be taken in respect of trades and professions carried on within the

Municipal limits, hitherto known as trade rates.

The rates on the issue of permits for building within the Municipal limits and the fees taken on the legalisation of contracts within the Municipal limits.

It is the duty of every Municipal Council-

To deal with nuisances in the manner provided by the Law.

To take the proceedings prescribed by the Law against persons carrying on noxious or offensive trades without the consent of the Municipality.

To take the proceedings prescribed by the Law, when any building or wall, etc., is in a ruinous state and dangerous to the public.

Kvery Municipal Council may make bye-laws to regulate the carrying on of any offensive trade, business or manufacture established with their consent.

Every Municipal Council may make bye-laws with respect to the following matters, that is to say:—

With respect to the level, width and construction of streets, and the provisions for the drainage thereof.
 With respect to the structure of walls, foundations, roofs and chimneys of new

buildings for securing stability, the prevention of fires, and for purposes of health.

(3). With respect to the sufficiency of the space about buildings to secure a free circulation of air, and with respect to the ventilation of buildings.

(4). With respect to the drainage of buildings, to earth closets, privies, ashpits and cesspools in connection with buildings kept for human habitation, and to the closing of buildings or parts of buildings unfit for human habitation and to the prohibition of their use for such habitation.

May eipas Commission Marfan, the High Commissioner in Council under The Municipal Councils' I. w. 1885 do.

Among the sources of revenue of Municipalities are the following:—

Fees on the slaughter: of animals, races for: stallage and pickage in the markets, rates on trades and professions, rates on building-permits, fees on legalisation of contracts, fees for storage of petroleum and lucifer matches, fines and penalties from prosecutions under Municipal Laws, fees for weighing and measuring under Law No. IV. of 1884, rents of Municipal properties, paving-rates, sale of Municipal property, &c., and, in the case of Limassol. a tax on the occupiers and renters! of immoveable property within the Municipal limits

PUBLIC DEBT.

Under an Annex to the Convention of 4th June, 1878, between Great Britain and Turkey the former power has undertaken to pay to the Porte annually a sum representing the excess of Revenue over Expenditure calculated on the average of the five years preceding the date of the Convention, excluding the droduce of State and Crown lands let or sold during that period. The amount to be paid has been determined to be £87,686 per annum; this to be in addition to 4,166,220 okes of Salt to be paid in kind.

The sum of £113 11s. 3d. per annum has also become payable, under the same annex, since the 4th September, 1884, when the Cyprus Government took over the administration of the Lighthouse Service in the Island. This sum represents 22°/. of the receipts of the Ottoman Lighthouse Administration which the Sublime Porte enjoyed under the concession granted the Company for lighting the Coast of Cyprus.

By a further Agreement of 3rd February, 1879, a further sum of £5,000 is to be paid annually to the Porte in respect of the produce of State lands.
